NOTE:        The National Law School of India University at Bangalore was established under the National Law School of India Act (Karnataka Act 22 of 1986). The NLSIU started its journey in 1987 under the stewardship of its Founder Director, Dr. N.R. Madhava Menon. The first batch of students joined on July 1, 1988 in the integrated five year B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Course. NLSIU started its courses in the premises of the Central College, Bangalore University and then . The NLSIU moved to its own premises at the present address in 1992.

ADMISSION TO THE UNDER-GRADUATE B.A.LL.B. (HONS.)  
PROGRAMME FOR 2004-2005 SESSION

Under-graduate Programme B.A.,LL.B. (Hons.)

The University offers a five-year Integrated B.A.,LL.B. (Hons.) Degree Programme preparing students for a career in Law.

- Eligibility: 10+2 School Examination or equivalent with not less than 50% marks

- (students taking qualifying examination in March/April 2004 are also eligible to apply);
- Age Limit: Below 20 years as on 1st July, 2004 (22 years in case of SC/ST candidates);
  - Intake and Reservation: The intake is 80 with reservation of 15% for SC and 7 ½% for ST candidates.
  - Financial assistance /fee waiver / Scholarship is available in deserving cases.

Admissions for the above programmes is based purely on merit, assessed at the All India Admission Test to be held on Sunday, the 2nd May, 2004 at Bangalore, Chennai, Delhi, Mumbai, Kochi, Hyderabad, Kolkatta, Allahabad and Chandigarh. All admissions will be completed on or before 30th June. Classes begin on 1st July, 2004.

For Application and Prospectus, write to the Registrar giving full address with Pincode and the course for which the application is required with a Bank Draft for Rs.600/- payable to the NLSIU at Bangalore. The envelope must be superscribed by writing in BOLD LETTERS, the appropriate course for which the application is required. Applications will be issued from 2nd January, 2004. Last date for receipt of completed Applications is 15th March, 2004.

The Test Paper is of 2 hours duration carrying 200 marks and will contain questions on (a) General Knowledge (b) General English (c) Legal Aptitude (d) Reasoning and (e) Mathematics.

NOTE: NALSAR UNIVERSITY of Law, established under the Andhra Pradesh Act 34 of 1998, is a body corporate having perpetual succession and a common seal. ELIGIBILITY & ADMISSION PROCEDURES- DEGREE  
PROGRAMME - B.A., B.L. (Hons.)

Admission to the First Year of the 5-year B.A., B.L. (Hons.) Degree Programme is made strictly on merit on the basis of an All India Entrance Test.

To be eligible for admission, a candidate should have passed the Higher Secondary School / Intermediate Examination (10+2) or its equivalent recognised by the University, having secured 50 percent marks and be less than 20 years of age as on 1st July, 2004 (22 years in case of SC/ST candidates).

Candidates awaiting results of the qualifying examination can also appear for the test on condition that they produce proof of having passed the qualifying examination with the prescribed marks at the time of interview. Students who are unable to clear the qualifying examination with the requisite marks or obtain a pass in compartment will not be considered.

Only those candidates who secure the minimum

prescribed marks at the Entrance Test will qualify for inclusion in the merit list.

#### INTAKE AND RESERVATION

i) 60 students to be admitted on the basis of entrance test with the following reservations:

20 seats are separately allotted for Foreign Nationals on Direct Admission basis.

#### DIRECT ADMISSION

The admission of Foreign nationals shall be made on the basis of prescribed academic qualification and an interview. If there are any vacancies these will be filled by the General candidates in the same order of merit.

Applications for admission to these seats can be made only after declaration of the qualifying exam result.

#### ENTRANCE TEST

The Entrance Test is designed to assess the candidate's suitability to the B.A., B.L. (Hons) course and will be conducted at 3.00 p.m on 3<sup>rd</sup> SUNDAY of May in Bangalore, Chandigarh, Chennai, Cochin, Delhi, Hyderabad and Kolkata.

The Test Paper is of 90 minutes duration carrying 150 marks and will contain questions on (a) General Knowledge - 50 marks; (b) General English - 30 marks; (c) Legal Aptitude - 20 marks; (d)

Reasoning - 20 marks; and (e) Essay - 30 marks.

The General Knowledge component will cover the following fields:

1. Significant legal events and developments
2. Current events of national and international importance
3. General Science
4. History of India
5. Geography
6. Indian Polity and Economy

Most questions will be multiple choice answers and there will be no negative marking.

Admission Procedure for the Academic Session 2004  
- 2005 BSc/BA, LLB (Hons.)

Note: NUJS is a fully residential law university located at Salt Lake in Calcutta. It is a fully residential university.

General Information: Candidates seeking admission must apply in the prescribed form, which can be obtained with the prospectus contained in NUJS Bulletin 2004 on payment of Rs. 400 by Bank Draft drawn in favour of National University of Juridical Sciences, payable at Kolkata. Rs. 50 will be charged extra for application forms by post. The forms are also available on the website in Rich Text Format.

BSc/BA, LLB (Hons.): Duration – Five Years, Number of seats–120 of which 12 are reserved for candidates belonging to SC/ST category and another 30 for Foreign/NRI sponsored students.

Eligibility-Higher Secondary (10+2 System) or an equivalent examination thereto securing at least 50% marks in aggregate with at least 35% marks in each of the core subjects and English language. Proficiency in English and knowledge of computer necessary, but no written proof needs to be submitted. Age - Not exceeding 21 years on 31 December 2004. For SC/ST candidates, maximum age limit is 22 years. NOTE: Candidates appearing for the qualifying examination in March/April 2004 may also apply. Their Admission will be provisional subject to their fulfilling the eligibility requirements by 31 August 2004. National Admission Test 2004: Selection will be made on the basis of National Admission Test to be held on Sunday 25 January 2004 at Bangalore, Delhi, Guwahati, Kolkata, Mumbai and Ranchi. The venue will be communicated to the candidates along with the

admission ticket.

Syllabus for the Test: The test for the BSc/BA LLB (Hons.) will be in two parts. The first part usually consists of mostly objective type questions of the standard expected of Higher Secondary school students on General Knowledge, General English and Mathematics. The second part consists of questions intended to test logical reasoning and aptitude for legal studies. The medium of test is English only. Many questions carry multiple-choice answers of which the most appropriate answer is to be marked. A few short answer questions may also be included. Previous years' Admission Test Question Papers for BSc/BA LLB (Hons.) course are available from NUJS Admissions Office on payment of Rs. 300 by Demand Draft favouring NUJS, Kolkata. Rs. 50 will be charged extra for question papers by post.

Submission of Application form: Applications for admission test shall be submitted to the Registrar, The National University of Juridical Sciences, 12 LB Block, Sector III, Salt Lake City, Kolkata - 700 098 on or before 15th December 2003. Those who use application forms available along with the Bulletin 2004 from the university shall pay Rs. 300 as Admission Test Fee. Others, who use downloaded forms, shall pay Rs. 600 as Composite Application and Admission Test fee. The amount shall be payable by Bank Draft favouring National University of Juridical Sciences payable at Kolkata. Applications without the Admission Test Fee or Composite Application and Admission Test fee as the case may be, shall not be entertained. Last date for submission of applications with delay fine of Rs. 100 per day is 26th December 2003. Candidates belonging to SC/ST category are not required to pay the Admission Test Fee. Two letters of recommendation, of which one shall be from the Principal of the School/College last

attended, should accompany all applications.

**Declaration of Results:** The list of the candidates selected for admission as also of those in the Waiting List will be displayed on the University Notice Board and in the university website on or before 30th March 2004. Those selected will be required to remit the prescribed fees etc. by challan to the University by Account Payee Demand Draft drawn in favour of WBNUJS Students' Fee Account between 1st and 15th April 2004 and complete the admission formalities including interview of candidates along with their parents on 27th/28th May 2004. In case some of the selected candidates fail to complete the admission formalities by due date, their seats will be offered to others according to rank in the merit list. Admission formalities will be closed on 30th May 2004. An Orientation Programme of the newly admitted students will be arranged at 10.00 AM on May 31, 2004 to which parents are also welcome. Classes will commence from Monday, June 1, 2004.

Note: The National Law Institute University (NLIU) has been established by Act No. 41 of 1997 of the Madhya Pradesh Legislature to fill the gap and providing most modern legal education through multidisciplinary teaching and training of newer skills needed for the profession. The University launched its first academic programme in 1998 and teaching for five year B.A., LL.B. course commenced from September 1 of that year.

At present the University is situated in verdant eco-friendly surroundings on Bhadbhada Road at the outskirts of Bhopal near the Kerwan Dam. The campus is surrounded with hills and lush greenery and the city is easily accessible. The NLIU has been allotted 40 acres of land on a hillock by the Government of Madhya Pradesh to develop a modern campus with modern academic and residential facilities.

Admission: The five year integrated course in B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) run by the National Law Institute University, Bhopal provides a golden opportunity to

candidates desirous of taking up law as a profession after passing their class 12th. Out of 80 seats, 40 seats are reserved for candidates from M.P., while the remaining 40 seats are available for All India candidates.

The duration of the B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Degree Course shall be five academic years. Each academic year shall be divided into three trimesters. The duration of each Trimester shall ordinarily be of 70 working days

- Admission to the B.A.LL.B.(Hons.) first year shall be made on the basis of an All-India Test to be conducted each year in the manner prescribed by the Director.
- Standard of Admission Test

The standard will generally be of Class-12 (of 10+2 system) of Madhya Pradesh Board of Secondary Education, Bhopal for Special English. Since, it is a competitive examination, questions will also be asked on analytical reasoning, Verbal reasoning, Legal Reasoning, Legal Aptitude and General Knowledge.

Details regarding the admission procedure would be given in the prospectus. The prospectus is ordinarily issued at the beginning of each year and is advertised widely in various national and regional newspapers. NOTE: The National Law University, established by National Law University Jodhpur, Act, 1999 (Act No. 22 of 1999), passed by the State of Rajasthan, is the fifth National University for Legal Education in the country following the institutions at Bangalore, Hyderabad, Bhopal and Calcutta. Every student of all streams has to study these twenty-seven courses. The University takes these subjects as the base and designs courses suitable for three streams as at present. Students preferring arts stream have to take additional nine courses in social sciences. Students preferring science stream shall take nine science courses and students preferring management studies shall take nine courses on management sciences. This will determine the first component of the integrated degree B.A. or B.Sc. or B.B.A.

#### Admission for 2003- 2004

1. There shall be a National Entrance Test (NET) twice every year for selecting students strictly on the basis of merit demonstrated in the result of the test and subsequent interview.
2. The admission test is held for the purpose of testing (a) linguistic ability; (b) analytical skills; (c) level of quantum of information; (d)

- mathematical aptitude; (e) legal reasoning; and (f) aptitude for learning law. Some preliminary psychological ability test may also be included. The National Entrance Test shall be held at such places and the University may notify time as.
3. The course of study is mainly based on social sciences/human sciences which shall be integrated with legal courses leading to the award of B.A / B.Sc. LL.B. (Hons.), over a period of five years. ('B.Sc.' here stands for Bachelor in the Science of Governance.) There shall be no conferment of intermediate degrees.
  4. The Candidate shall have passed in the qualifying examination (Senior School Examination or the 10+2 Examination) with minimum 50% marks in aggregate.
  5. Admission to the University shall be based on merit; yet all the Scheduled Tribe Candidates from the State, especially from the Scheduled Areas of the State and have secured First Division, in the Secondary School Examination (Class 10 Examination) or Senior School Examination (10+2 Examination), may proceed to go for the interview, without appearing in the National Entrance Test (NET). All other Scheduled Tribe & Scheduled Caste, other Backward class and women candidates will have to appear for the National Entrance Test, and preferential consideration will be given to those candidates in matters of admission, provided they obtain the general cut-off marks determined by the Admission Committee in each year. All the candidates referred to in this Para, will have to undergo a specially designed training course in (a) General English and (b) Computer Applications, for a duration of minimum one month before classes for Ist Semester begin, if found necessary. The unsuccessful candidates of these categories would be permitted to appear in the mid-year entrance examination with appropriate age relaxation.
  6. Foreign, Non-Resident Indian applicants and Indian applicants staying abroad at the time of National

- Entrance Test (NET) shall take the admission test at the place indicated by the University .
7. Every selected candidate shall produce two reference letters from the Head of the School/College, members of the Faculty of the School/College testifying to the character of selected candidates.
  8. The application form for appearing in NET shall accompany a draft of Rs. 500/- (US \$ 100 in case of NRI and Foreign applicants). All SC/ST candidates may submit the filled in application form without any fee, but along with an attested copy of their SC/ST certificates, as a proof of their claim. There is no fee for appearing in the test.
  9. The Application Form shall be available from the web site of the University.
  10. Last date for submitting filled in Application Form to be received at the notified Centers (where NET is conducted) with required particulars, and accompanied by two passport size photographs and a draft of Rs. 500/- (US \$ 100 in case of NRI and Foreign applicants) payable to the Registrar, Hidayatullah National Law University, Chhattisgarh at Raipur, is June each year (check the website for updates). The SC/ST candidates are exempted from the payment of the said fee, but shall produce a caste/tribe certificate, to substantiate their claim.
  11. As a special case for this year only, the candidates may submit the Application Form, on 15<sup>th</sup> before the test is conducted, at the discretion of the Center-Director
  12. Entrance test shall be held at, Bangalore, Bhopal, Bilaspur, Cochin, Delhi, Hyderabad, Jaipur, Kolkata, Madras, Patna, Raipur and Ranchi, or at other centers which will be duly notified.
  13. National Entrance Test shall be held at such place in the City as mentioned in the Hall ticket between 9 a.m to 11 a. m in June of each year (check

the website for updates).

Interview with the Vice Chancellor and the Faculty members along with their parents will be held.
